It's time that we step back and re-focus. "Am I really serving God or am I serving Him as long as I don't have anything else to do?" Sunday activities are robbing our Heavenly Father of the worship and service He deserves, after all He loved us enough to sacrifice Jesus for us (John 3:16) so what am I sacrificing for Him? Let us continue to be good people serving a Good God with steadfastness and consistency.
