### Lesson 7 – Second Accusations Against Job – Chapters 15-21

1. Eliphaz accuses Job of arrogance, saying Job's own \_\_\_\_\_ condemns him. (15:6)
2. He asked Job, "Do you listen to God or do you rely on your own \_\_\_\_\_?" (15:8)
3. Eliphaz continues to express his belief that sin causes misery by saying, "The \_\_\_\_\_ man writhes with pain all his days." (15:20)
