	0	What is the purpose of a gate?
		Gates were a part of everyday life for these people. Jerusalem had many gates/entrances, and typically people would want to travel on paths with wide gates and broad paths because they were safer. To put it simply, traveling on a road with a wide gate was easy.
	0	What does the path of the wide gate lead to?
	Ü	 Just like the road in their present day on a wide gate would be easy, so it is also easier in our own lives to walk the same path as everyone else. Is that what Jesus wants for us? As Christians we are called to love others more than ourselves, to practice
		self-discipline, be humble, and deny our sin nature. Does that line up with the teaching of the world?
	0	What does the path of the narrow gate lead to?
		The road from Jericho to Jerusalem was known to be a narrow, winding, rocky path that ascended quickly. Many of those listening to Jesus's sermon would have traveled that road and know how difficult it was to travel the less taken path.
		 Not only is the narrow path difficult to travel, but it's also more difficult for people to find, let alone stay on. (Matthew 7:21)
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•	Not on	lly is the narrow gate less common, but there are also forces at work against
	us that	t we must recognize and be able to discern against. (v. 15-16)
	0	Just like we see today, the early church had to work against false prophets and
		watch for people that tried to lead others away from God. (Acts 20:28-31).
		■ There are some people that are enemies of God that have characteristics that are easy to see (2 Timothy 3:1-5).
		• Why is it important to recognize that these people would be in "sheep's clothing"?
		 It is easy to prepare for an enemy that speaks loudly or announces
		their presence. However, someone working quietly against you is
		harder to find and work against.
