v. 22-23 Does God Know You?	
1.	"Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in
	Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?'" (v. 22)
2.	Jesus implies that the U L T U will believe they deserve salvation.
3.	"And then I will declare to them, 'I never you; depart from Me, you who
	practice lawlessness.'" (v. 23)
4.	Many people will know God but not His law; thus, God will not know them.

v. 24-25 Build Upon the Rock	
1.	"Therefore everyone who these words of Mine, and C upon
	them, may be compared to a wise man, who built his house upon the rock." (v. 24)
2.	God has supplied us with His Word, but it is up to us to F L O what He says.
3.	Wisdom is found in the one who both listens to the Word and acts on it.
4.	"And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and burst against
	that house, and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded upon the rock." (v. 25)
5.	Hearing and following God's law will build up a firm foundation when the
	of life descend.
v. 26-2	27 The House Upon the Sand
1.	"And everyone who hears these words of Mine, and does not act upon them, will be like
	a man, who built his house upon the sand." (v. 26)
2.	Only a fool does not E E to God's instruction.
3.	"And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and burst against
	that house; and it, and great was its fall." (v. 27)
4.	Disregarding God's Word makes for a shaky and N S U R life.
v. 28-2	29 Jesus Concludes
1.	"The result was that when Jesus had finished these words, the multitudes were
	at His teachina: for He was teachina them as one havina authority.
