# The Gospel of Matthew (Chapter 8:10-22)

#### V. 10 Jesus Marvels at the Centurion

- 1. "Now when Jesus heard this, He marveled, and said to those who were following, "Truly I say to you, I have not found such a great \_\_\_\_\_\_ with anyone in Israel."
- 2. *Discussion Point:* How do you think Jesus' followers reacted to His comment on the centurion's faith?

## V. 11-12 Jesus Warns the Israelites

- 1. "And I say to you, that many shall come from \_\_\_ A \_\_\_ T and W \_\_\_\_ T, and recline at the table with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven;" (v. 11)
- Jesus is referencing the Jewish idea of a great \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ after the day of judgement.
- 3. "but the sons of the kingdom shall be cast \_\_\_\_\_\_ into the outer

- 4. **Discussion Point:** Why is Jesus so stern with His followers?

## V. 13 Jesus Heals the Centurion's Servant

- "And Jesus said to the centurion, "Go your way; let it be done to you as you have
   \_\_\_\_\_\_." And the servant was healed that very hour."
- 2. The story of the centurion and his servant reveals that Jesus can heal both
  - \_\_\_ N S \_\_\_ A \_\_\_ L \_\_\_ and from anywhere.
- 3. Jesus heals the centurion's servant because he \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- 4. Discussion Point: What lessons can we take from the story of the centurion?

## V. 14-15 Jesus Heals Peter's Mother-in-Law

- "And when Jesus had come to Peter's home, He saw his mother-in law lying sick in bed with a \_\_\_\_\_\_. And He \_\_ O U \_\_ H \_\_\_ her hand, and the fever left her; and she arose, and waited on Him."
- 2. Jesus again demonstrates His healing abilities.
- 3. This is the \_\_\_\_\_\_ time Jesus heals through touch.
- 4. Following her healing, Peter's mother-in-law chooses to \_\_\_\_\_\_ Jesus.
- 5. **Discussion Point:** Like Peter's mother-in-law, we have been healed by Jesus; thus, what can we do to show our gratitude?

#### V. 16-17 Jesus Fulfills Isaiah's Prophecy

- 1. "And when evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed; and He cast out the spirits with a W \_\_\_\_ D, and healed all who were ill." (v. 16)
- 2. There was no one who could \_\_\_\_\_\_ be healed by Jesus.
- "in order that what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet might be
   \_\_\_\_\_\_, saying, 'He Himself took our infirmities, and carried away our diseases.'" (v. 17)
- 4. The multitudes are continually witnessing the power of Jesus.

## V. 18-22 The Commitment to Following Jesus

- "Now when Jesus saw a crowd around Him, He gave orders to depart to the other side. And a certain scribe came and said to Him, 'Teacher, I will \_\_ O L \_\_ W You wherever You go.'" (v. 18-19)
- 2. Discussion Point: What is the significance of a scribe choosing to follow Jesus?
- "And Jesus said to him, 'The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has \_\_\_\_\_\_ to lay His head.'" (v. 20)
- 4. Jesus reveals the cost of following Him. It can be a difficult commitment that never
- "And another of the disciples said to Him, 'Lord, permit me \_\_\_\_\_\_ to go and bury my father.' But Jesus said to him, 'Follow Me; and allow the \_\_ E \_\_ D to bury their own dead.'" (v. 21-22)
- 6. Jesus also reveals that His followers must prioritize their needs no matter how difficult it may be.
- 7. Discussion Point: What does Jesus mean by "allow the dead to bury their dead?"
