20. Jesus acknowledges that His arrest must happen to the "Scriptures of the prophets."

Jesus Before Caiaphas and the Council

21. Jesus is put on R I L in front of Caiaphas and his council.
22. The council sought out witnesses.
23. Two men declared that Jesus said "'I am able to the temple of God, and to
it in three days.'" (Matt. 26:61)
a. This quote was taken out of context
b. The "temple" that Jesus referred to was His (John 2:9)
24. Rather than fighting, Jesus A C P T S His fate and once again claims to be the "Son of Man."
(Matt. 26:64)
25. Jesus is convicted of and told He deserved death.
26. "' to us, you Christ! Who is it that struck you?'" (Matt. 26:68)
Peter Denies Jesus
1. Following Jesus' trial, bystanders proclaim that Peter was one of Jesus' followers.
27. Peter D E E S his affiliation with Jesus.
28. After denying Jesus for the third time, "the crowed." (Matt. 26:75)
29. Peter then remembered what Jesus told him and " bitterly." (Matt. 26:75)
