Successful Visitation

- > Never, never join in gossip
- > Don't share your medical history (unless asked to)
- > Talk about the God, Jesus and the church
- Read the bible together
- > Read passages that bring comfort & support
- > Pray together
- > Remember, visiting is a Christian privilege

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
